

Southwest Asia (Middle East) Timeline Project

Dear Students,

Many of you have expressed an interest in a more detailed lesson on the history of Europe. I would love to teach it to you, but the standards dictate the pace of this class and we must move on. The good news is that maybe this project will help you teach yourself about the things you want to learn about.

You must create a timeline using a poster, tri-board, piece of paper, or PowerPoint presentation. If you choose to do a PowerPoint then you must save it on a flash drive and bring it to me by the due date. Please save it as European Timeline.

You will research *at least* 10 events and people. You will write in complete sentence and put your findings on a timeline with accurate dates. Remember to consult your notes and your textbook. The years are from 1300-1989 A.D.


You are required, *in order to pass*, to include dates and an explanation for:

1. The division between the Shia and Sunni Muslims (You must explain why they parted ways.) (SS7G8d)
 2. The creation of Israel (You must include the reasons for creation and rational for deciding to put it where it is. (SS7H2b)
 3. The discovery of Oil in the Middle East (SS7H3c)
 4. The Persian Gulf War (SS7H2d)
 5. Operation Enduring Freedom (SS7H2d)
 6. Operation Iraqi Freedom (SS7H2d)

Your research will turn up other interesting things. You are encouraged to include anything or anyone extra that you find fascinating.

Dates on top of the line and 1-3 sentence explanations on the bottom of the line.

Explanation

For people include the birth day and death day. For the explanation make sure you explain why the event or the person is important. A rubric has been included on the back of this sheet you will attach the rubric to the back of your project with a paper clip or staple. No glue please.

20 points off for no rubric. If you lose it get another copy before the due date because if you bring the project with no rubric on the due date I cannot help you.

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European Timeline: Rubric
